

### Here We Go One More Time!

ne More Time to watch top thoroughbreds train using the ThoroFan Guide to the Saratoga Race Course Trainers' Saddle Towels. The Guide includes trainers entered in races in 2021 and those that might enter in 2022. Unfortunately, not all Towels are shown. Missing ones are listed on page 57.

One More Time to recognize Chad Brown as the H. Allen Jerkens leading trainer of the 2021 Meeting – his 3rd at Saratoga. 2021 was a particularly memorable season for Chad, when he notched his 2000th career win – 5 years after his 1000th. Will he do it One More Time?

One More Time for Connections to grab a win and maybe a piece of the record high purses (\$22.6M) and 77 Graded stakes races at The Spa's 40 day gathering – \$1.1 M more than 2021. The number of trainers competing rose from the 222 in 2020 to 245, climbing to pre-Covid numbers. See page 34 for 2021's top 10.

*One More Time* the Jockey Colony returned to Saratoga in full force, rising from 28 in 2020 to 92 last year. The best of the best and those who want to be the best find their way here. It's an all-star show. See page 52 for last year's top 10.

**One More Time** for trainers, jockeys, exercise riders, grooms, and hotwalkers to set up camp at the famed backstretch on either side of Union Avenue as they have done for almost 160 years.

#### It was **One More Time** for local trainer Chad Brown!



The back-and-forth rivalry between Todd Pletcher and Chad Brown continued in 2021. This time it was Chad who took the *H. Allen Jerkens* title with 10-win margin. It was 15 years since he hung out his own shingle after taking a hard turn from breaking and training harness horses and heading down the

road to a leading trainer in the thoroughbred world. That road began with starting as a hotwalker, groom, and foreman for Hall of Famer Shug McGaughey. He then became an assistant for another Hall of Famer, Bobby Frankel, before deciding that this was the road he wanted to travel on his own. It's been a long journey since his application for stalls at Saratoga in 2008 was turned down. He now has 120+ stalls in 3 well maintained backside locations with a team of 70+ stable hands, exercise riders, foremen and

assistants. He constantly credits this team that he has assembled as the foundation for the continued success of the CB logo. This team enabled him to garner his 2000th career win while at The Spa last year and with his 2022 Preakness win the road ahead looks bright indeed!

In this years guide, trainers' towels have been indexed by the background color of the towel, into 6 color categories:


- BLACK & BROWN

## WHILE WATCHING THE MORNING WORKOUT:

- identify the main color of the saddle towel

- identify the trainer by additional colors, letters, and logos

#### WHY ARE SADDLE TOWELS USED?

Racehorses are athletes and therefore have to condition their muscles, just like human athletes do, before racing.

Jockeys on horses entered in the afternoon races wear the unique colors of the horse's owners. When horses train in the mornings, the trainers use unique saddle towels on their horses so that they, the Gap Attendants, and the Clockers can identify them as they conduct their workouts in accordance with New York State Racing and Wagering Board Rule 4003.53 which states:

"...A trainer desiring to engage a horse in a work-out shall, prior to such work-out, cause the following to be specified to a work-out coordinator: the name of the horse, the distance the horse will work-out and at what point on the facility the work-out is intended to begin..."

The people who time the horses as they workout in the morning are called Clockers. The Clockers not only time the horses and note the distance that they run, but also how hard they were ridden and urged by the rider.



































































































































### The Wilson Chute Returns to the Saratoga Race Course ONE MORE TIME!


#### WHO Was Wilson?

In 1899 Richard Thornton Wilson Jr. rescued Saratoga from its floundering reputation. He teamed up with W.C. Whitney to purchase the facility and bring the track back **One More Time**. It was the first of 3 times that he would do this.

In 1909, Wilson became President of the *Saratoga Association for the Improvement of the Breed of the Horse*. In 1902 he reoriented the layout of the original 1864 oval. As part of that he constructed a nerw starting chute to give a new popular 1-mile option for racing fans.

In 1911-1912 NYS banned racing. When it was lifted, Wilson brought back Spa racing *One More Time*. Later in 1919 Saratoga Association president WWI, a global Pandemic and Prohibition all occurred during his tenure and he kept it all together resuming racing at the top level *One More Time*. While at The Spa, Wilson established the Reading Room at the Grand Union Hotel (1910). He also brought the renowned Fasig-Tipton thoroughbred horse sales to town that added another facet to the gem that is Saratoga. In addition to the major reorientation of the initial 1864 racing oval (1902), Wilson oversaw the construction of today's Turf Terrace and the iconic Clubhouse (1928).

Wilson was a true racing enthusiast with many top runners. "Hannibal," and Wilderness in Wilson's green trimmed yellow silks, won The Travers in 1919 and 1923.



It became the Wilson Chute in 1930 upon his passing in 1929 and the distance was honored as the Wilson Mile. A new race, the Wilson Memorial, was inaugurated at the 1-mile distance. The first running in 1930 under this name was won by Battleship Gray, son of Man O'War. Another son of Man O'War, War Admiral, took the race in 1938. #### WHAT is the Wilson Chute?

or racecourses with a 1-1/8-mile distance, 1-mile races are difficult as horses can instantly bunch up approaching the first turn. The potential for accidents is high as jockeys race for position. A chute tangential the turn mitigates this problem by giving a longer straight run allowing the field to thin out as the race unfolds.

Saratoga had its first Chute in the early years (Figure 1). A diagonal intersected the original 11/8-mile oval. It cut across the infield from the first turn to near the end of the backstretch. Fans viewed both starts and finishes of most races. When the Travers Stakes was 134 miles long (1864 to 1889), horses passed the finish line twice. 5-furlong races started in the middle of the chute. Horses ran almost immediately into a first turn.

In 1902 Wilson reoriented the track by 25 degrees westward to keep the sun out of fans eyes. The original diagonal was eliminated, and 2 new start points were added – a 7 furlong still used today (red) and a 1-mile one set back from the first turn the Wilson Chute (yellow). Racing from the mile chute ceased in 1972. Interest had faded, possibly because inside-post horses had an advantage and fields were light. The Chute returned for the 2nd time in 1992 for 25 races. Additional parking off that first turn outweighed the need for races at that historic distance and it was not used until this year's return.

Now the Wilson Chute returns One More Time 30 years later in Saratoga's 159th year. Richard Thornton Wilson Jr. must be smiling from his spot on the Clubhouse ridge.




















#### SARATOGA IN BLOOM AGAIN ONE MORE TIME!

2021 saw the return of Fans, Horses, Owners, Jockeys and Trainers to The Spa. More Stakes were on the card, 20 of which were graded. Purses were up, climbing to pe-Covid levels. The Track was in the best shape in years, the turf spectacular. Saratoga was ready to go!

And off we went. The chase for the *H. Allen Jerkens Leading Trainer Award* continued to be battled out between the perennial top two – Chad Brown & Todd Pletcher. The rest of the top 10 had some new names. Among them was retired Jonathan Sheppard protégé *Keri Brion*. Campaigning *Baltimore Bucko* and Eclipse Winner *The Mean Queen*, Keri burst onto the scene winning the 2 Grade 1 Steeplechase Events. She also picked up a 3rd stake win.

While Chad Brown notched his 2000th win during the 2022 season here at The Spa, Hall of Famer **Steve Asmussen** won 5 Grade 1s here, on his way to breaking Dale Baird's record on August 7th to become the All-Time winning North American Trainer with his 9,447th Win Photo at Saratoga. He now has over 9,700.

2021 saw the best of racing return to The Spa *One More Time!* In 2022 The Spa is ready to welcome them back.



### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN A

# Workout

Owners, trainers, jockeys, clockers, handicappers and pretty much anyone else in racing watch morning workouts and try to learn something. How fast is that horse? How competitive is this horse? How fit? How ready? Expert or not, it can be great fun to watch training at a racetrack, especially one as historic and meaningful as Saratoga. A racehorse trains almost every day. He or she gallops (slower than race speed) sometimes as far as 2 miles; jogs (trots) to warm up or to get some light exercise. Racehorses work or breeze (race speed) once a week or so, usually a half-mile or 5 furlongs though sometimes longer. While watching the action, look for riders trying to teach horses how to switch leads (left on the turns, right in the stretch), how to relax, how to wait for their cues. Riders don't want horses to pull too hard, or to be too lazy. It's all about balance. A galloping racehorse should be energetic, bouncy, light on its feet, but manageable. Even a novice can tell if a horse is pulling too hard – its rider will be leaning back, tugging on the reins. A rider on a relaxed horse will look just the opposite – hands down, reins comparatively loose, weight balanced over the saddle. Working or breezing, the same thoughts apply. A breezing racehorse should be doing it at least somewhat on its own - with little encouragement or urging. Discerning names can be difficult in the busy atmosphere, but morning exercise offers a rare chance to find some heroes. Keep an eye on the saddle towels and other clues and you might just recognize a superstar such as Horse of Year, Eclipse, & Whitney winner Knicks Go, Travers winner Essential Quality and Hopeful winner Gunnite. Before and after a training session, you can see horses "standing in" to face the track. It's a way for them to relax, take a deep breath and realize life's not always about running.




















Seven Wilson Stakes winning horses had racing careers that got them into the US Hall of Fame. They are:

Devil Diver, Discovery\*, Eight Thirty\*, Equipoise\*, Gallorette\* Tom Fool, and War Admiral. Gallorette holds the record time of 1:35.40 for the mile.

\*Won the Wilson twice.

Trainer John M. Gaver Sr. won the race 6 times, and Owner John Hay "Jock" Whitney's **Greentree Stable** took home the trophy 6 times. Jockey Ted Atkinson was first to the wire 5 times. Atkinson rode the last edition of the Wilson in 1953 aboard Greentree's **Tom Fool**.

Other notables included: Oscar White's *Pavot* (1946) and "Sunny Jim Fitzsimmons' *Apache* 1942.




