


2023 GUIDE to Saratoga Race Course Trainers' Saddle Towels



The BEST of the BEST for 160 YEARS! The Spa Endures, But Why?





n Friday, August 28, 2015, I wore a new blue short-sleeved t-shirt with yellow lettering on the front that read #PHAROAHTOGA 2015 as I entered the Saratoga Race Course.

By 7:30 a.m., the oldest sporting venue in the US was filled with a crowd of at least 15,000 people. This mass of humanity gathered not to watch a race, but to witness one horse complete a morning workout. That horse was American Pharoah – the first to win the Triple Crown since Affirmed in 1978 – and as the crowd roared, he went from a leisurely trot to a gallop as he passed the grandstands.

This was a day when everyone who was not there now says they were. That is because no one who was there for this morning workout was disappointed, while the same could not be said the next day when Keen Ice won the Travers and American Pharoah finished second.

Morning workouts in Saratoga are special even when there is not a Triple Crown winner in attendance. Here, the horses do not fly by you at their top speeds. Instead, some stand in one place for a few minutes or slowly walk along the rail. You are so close that you can hear them breath and sometimes you can chat with their exercise rider.

Bring the whole family, your own coffee, pastries, or breakfast sandwich, and of course this towel guide. Its production is a labor of love by my friend, Bob Giordano, and ThoroFan. They want to be sure those who attend morning workouts, and the races fall in love with the horses, this sport, this venue, and this amazing city we call home – Saratoga Springs.

The Best of the Best!

elcome for the 15th time to the **ThoroFan Guide** to the Saratoga Race Course Trainers' Saddle Towels. The purpose of this Guide is twofold – to recognize the achievement of the 2022 leading trainer and also to continue the ThoroFan mission statement that "An Educated Fan is a Better Fan".

Chad Brown was the Best in2022, taking home the 2022 trading title with 42 wins and earnings of \$6.2M. This was 4 more than perennial challenger Todd Pletcher. Their rivalry ensues for this 160th gathering of the best of the best at The Spa. Maybe this year will be the first for a new leader?

While Steve Asmussen finished 4th in the trainer standings, Spa fans saw him become "the Best" last August when he became all-time wins record holder in North America with his 9,446th wins here, surpassing the mark set by late trainer Dale Baird. Having notched his 10,000th visit to the winner circle in February, Steve rolls on. He is currently 2nd in the world - 636 behind Peru's Juan Suarez Villarroel (10,397). Last year, fans saw the Asmussen colt **Epicenter** don the blanket of red and white carnations and take the **Man O' War Cup** in the 158th running of the Travers.



And in 2022 jockey John Velasquez became "the Best"- the all-time leading jockey at Saratoga notching his 1,000th career win. Jockey Irad Ortiz Jr. took the meet riding title with 55 wins, leading the rest by 16. Saratoga fans see the best of the best here, particularly in the mornings - arguably the best time to experience thoroughbreds at The Spa.

The 2nd purpose of this Guide is to give fans a better understanding of the sport. In these pages you will learn how to spot the horses trained by the more than 220 conditioners who set up camp here each year, what look for, and what makes these current and future Hall of Famers along with their Owners want to compete here, and answer the question "Why Saratoga?"




HOW to locate a Trainers' Towel

BY BACKGROUND COLOR

In this years guide, trainers' towels have been indexed by the background color of the towel, into 6 color categories:

BLACK & BROWN
BLUE, TEAL, & PURPLE
GREEN
RED, ORANGE, & PINK
WHITE & GREY
YELLOW & GOLD



OR BY NAME INDEX

An alphabetical listing of trainers' towels is on pages 49-52.

Some trainers use Owners logos. In such cases the owner's name is in "()".

WHILE WATCHING THE MORNING WORKOUT:

- identify the main color of the saddle towel
- go to the towels' main color section in this booklet
- identify the trainer by additional colors, letters, and logos

WHY ARE SADDLE TOWELS USED?

Racehorses are athletes and therefore have to condition their muscles, just like human athletes do, before racing.

Jockeys on horses entered in the afternoon races wear the unique colors of the horse's owners. When horses train in the mornings, the trainers use unique saddle towels on their horses so that they, the Gap Attendants, and the Clockers can identify them as they conduct their workouts in accordance with New York State Racing and Wagering Board Rule 4003.53 which states:


"...A trainer desiring to engage a horse in a work-out shall, prior to such work-out, cause the following to be specified to a work-out coordinator: the name of the horse, the distance the horse will work-out and at what point on the facility the work-out is intended to begin..."


The people who time the horses as they workout in the morning are called Clockers. The Clockers not only time the horses and note the distance that they run, but also how hard they were ridden and urged by the rider.







aratoga Springs native R.C. (Bob) Ewell said farewell to the Saratoga backstretch community last Thanksgiving weekend. He was 91. And he was a friend.

For decades Bob woke with the birds to begin his trek through the Saratoga barns to chronicle the behind-the-scenes activity of thoroughbred horse racing daily life. His camera captured everyday early morning images of the horses and workers as seen through his creative eye. Saying that he



"did not want to invest time nor money to pursue formal training and also ensure I was influenced as little as possible by others", this self-taught watercolorist, would transform these images to produce over 2,000 paintings in his unique style. Every two years he exhibited his works at the Saratoga Springs Heritage Area Visitor Center – a highlight of the summer season. R.C. "Bob" Ewell paintings are found in many homes in the horse racing world.

Bob was a friend of the *Guide to Saratoga Trainers' Saddle Towels* as well. For each of the 15 editions, he donated new images spotted during morning workouts to help make this publication what it is today. As you thumb through this 15th Edition you will find examples of what Bob put to canvas during his 31 year journey through Saratoga's mornings.

And if you find yourself watching Oklahoma workouts from the Whitney Viewing Stand look for exercise riders tipping a crop as they pass the ranch style home at the 5/8 pole where Bob lived.








View from my Back Yard - RC Ewell

Why Saratoga?

Saratoga has the **Best of the Best** competing at the top level of the sport for the most money at any US meet. Racing is a business, and taking home a check is good for business!

Success in any business is fueled by a driving passion and hard work. There are no "days off" in this business. There is overhead. Success in the horseracing business is entering and placing in races. "There's no money to be made if the horse stays in the barn." Purses keep a trainer in business, and a smart trainer knows his horse and the

best spot to for it to compete.

This year's Kentucky Derby winning trainer, Gustavo Delgado, – another "Giant Killer" – said it best after winning Saratoga's Grade 1 "The Test" with **Paolo Queen** in 2016 – "If you work hard, and you have a good horse- a really good horse – he can take you to Dubai, to the moon, to outer space, and to Saratoga!" Kinda says it all for Saratoga, doesn't it?

Why do trainers make the trip from all over the Americas, Europe, and sometimes the Far East

try for a win at this oldest racing venue in the US? Of the 65 racetracks in the country, only 12 offer competition at the highest level – Grade I Stakes. There are only 97 sanctioned Grade 1's in the country. After discounting the rolling venues for the Breeder's Cup races, in 2023, the most – 19 (22%!) – were held at Saratoga (see page 42). The highest purse money for Grade I's awaits here – over \$10M. Purses for the 416 races held over the 40 days of racing here in 2022 totaled \$49.6M – averaging \$192,000 a race! More than 200 trainers shipped their stables to compete at this elite race meet in 2022. Many walked away with satisfied Owners.

The competition between the very best horses, trainers, and jockeys, offering the best racing in the country for the highest purses in the only racecourse within city limits of a community that works hard to welcome these stars and their fans is here at Saratoga. For those involved in the game, nothing tops a win photo at America's Race Course. It makes that hard work and dedication worthwhile. And it is certainly good for business – especially when you beat the odds and make it another "Graveyard of a Favorite." Champions have lost here at The Spa – as the "Giant Killer" depicted on the Cover proved when his horse **Onion** surprised the world when he defeated that "Tremendous Machine" – **Secretariat** in the 1974 Whitney!



Every trainer's question: "What race class do I want to enter my horse?"

acing classes categorize horses based on experience and skill levels, pitting horses at similar stages of their careers against each other to make races competitive. The trainer's decision to select the race to enter is strategic. Choosing the right race to enter is a combination of many things. A *"Condition Book,"* published by the track racing office, gives trainers a choice of race classes to enter their horse to have a good chance to win – or, as in some cases, - put the horse up for sale to allow another trainer to condition him. Many claimed

horses have gone on to achieve real success

 Stakes Races – top horses, largest purses; entry fee (stake) require which is part of the purse. Criteria for each class established annually by the Thoroughbred Owners & Breeders Association (TOBA). Nominations and entries made weeks to months in advance. Purse criteria assigned. One recent example is trainer **Eric Reed** who claimed a horse for \$30,000 and parlayed that into \$1.86M by winning the 2022 \$3M Kentucky Derby with Rich Strike. He picked the right race!


- Graded horses of same age group and sometimes sex. Assigned weights can vary depending on age and sex and number of races won.
 G I – \$300k minimum; Grade II – \$200k minimum; Grade III – \$100k minimum.
- o Listed, Restricted, Unlisted Minimum purse \$75k
- o Invitational Stake
 - \checkmark Special horses "Invited" to enter without owners contributing to the purse.
- o Handicap Stakes
 ✓ Official handicapper assigns weights to each horse, to equalize the competition.
- Overnight A race of any type developed during the meet; entries close a specific number of hours before running. Usually, a lesser caliber than regular stakes.
- Classified Allowance Last level of race before entering a Stakes race.
- Allowance A step up in class for Maiden and claimed horses. No claiming price.
 - o Most variety: weight assigned to even the field, (speed affected by the weight carried).
 - o Horses not yet ready for stakes competition.
 - o An "allowance" is given horses not winning since a specific date or a set amount of money.
 - o Typically, 5 pounds less than other horses in the race carry.
 - o Many sub-classes of allowance races.

Starter Allowance

- o Gives horses a chance to race without being claimed.
- Maiden
 - o Maiden horses that never won a race Special Weight.
- Claiming Lowest class of racing; horses in the race are for sale.



what to look for in a Workout

Owners, trainers, jockeys, clockers, handicappers and pretty much anyone else in racing watch morning workouts and try to learn something. How fast is that horse? How competitive is this horse? How fit? How ready? Expert or not, it can be great fun to watch training at a racetrack, especially one as historic and meaningful as Saratoga. A racehorse trains almost every day. He or she gallops (slower than race speed) sometimes as far as 2 miles; jogs (trots) to warm up or to get some light exercise. Racehorses work or breeze (race speed) once a week or so, usually a half-mile or 5 furlongs though sometimes longer. While watching the action, look for riders trying to teach horses how to switch leads (left on the turns, right in the stretch), how to relax, how to wait for their cues. Riders don't want horses to pull too hard, or to be too lazy. It's all about balance. A galloping racehorse should be energetic, bouncy, light on its feet, but manageable. Even a novice can tell if a horse is pulling too hard – its rider will be leaning back, tugging on the reins. A rider on a relaxed horse will look just the opposite - hands down, reins comparatively loose, weight balanced over the saddle. Working or breezing, the same thoughts apply. A breezing racehorse should be doing it at least somewhat on its own – with little encouragement or urging. Discerning names can be difficult in the busy atmosphere, but morning exercise offers a rare chance to find some heroes. Keep an eye on the saddle towels and other clues and you might just recognize a superstar such as Horse of Year, Eclipse, & Whitney winner Knicks Go, Travers winner Essential Quality and Hopeful winner Gunnite. Before and after a training session, you can see horses "standing in" to face the track. It's a way for them to relax, take a deep breath and realize life's not always about running.


